


## Middletown Township Historical Society: February Happenings



This unopened bottle was donated to us by MTHS member David Long. The Kress and Owen Company moved into Middletown in 1951 and built a small factory to produce its Glyco-Thymoline product, a mouthwash. The building, located on Route 35 near Oak Hill Road, still exists, and is now in use as a car wash. The company moved out in the late 1960s.
