VIRTUAL EVENT: June 15, 7:00 pm

Origins of the US Coast Guard & the Sandy Hook Life Saving Station, presented by Mary Rasa

Due to the continued pandemic, we have decided to try our first virtual event! This way, you can attend from the comfort of your own home. Please note that <u>registration is required</u>, and may be limited.

This presentation highlights the history of the US Coast Guard through its predecessor organizations, from George Washington's presidency to 1915. Also covered will be the first structure built for lifesaving by the federal government, which was built at Sandy Hook in 1849.

Mary Rasa worked for the National Park Service at Sandy Hook from 1992 to 2009. She received her Master of Library Science in 2018. Mary resides in Maryland and works as a historical consultant conducting research and exhibit work, in addition to conducting history lectures to local organizations.

As always, the event is free to attend, but it does require <u>registration</u>. After you complete the brief <u>registration form</u>, you will receive an email that includes a link to the virtual event. Just click that link on June 15 a few minutes before 7:00 pm, and you'll be welcomed into our event! You may be asked to download a Zoom application, if you don't already have it installed. You will watch the presentation on your screen, and can listen either through your device or your phone (instructions will be provided).

What's New with the Society?

While much of life has slowed down during this pandemic, MTHS has remained active behind the scenes.

 For the past couple of months we have asked you to be part of our planned <u>Middletown Memories</u> video series, but unfortunately due to distancing concerns, it might be a little while before we can actually begin conducting the interviews. - We have applied for a grant to digitize old Middletown school yearbooks, so that they can be searched and viewed on our website. - We are also working on creating an interactive map of the town that shows the history of the housing developments and streets. We'll be sharing that with you in the near future, and asking for the help of volunteers.
- As always, we remain on the lookout for a permanent place for our archive so that we can properly catalog it and make it available online or for in-person inspection. If anyone knows of potential locations, <u>we'd love</u> to hear about them.

We are all familiar with Oral Histories- interviews with people captured on

audio. MTHS is starting a new project similar to that, but we're going to use video instead of audio. This will allow us to reach a larger base and include interesting visuals such as old photographs and contemporary locations. This project will help broaden our reach and will be an excellent collection of first-person memories for generations to come.
