


# Middletown Township Historical Society: May Happenings

Online Presentation - Monday, May 17 at 7:00 pm:

Monmouth County's Most Famous Commune: The North American Phalanx (1843-1855)

#### Presented by Jayme A. Sokolow, Ph.D.

Inspired by the French philosopher Charles Fourier, a group of like-minded people formed a utopian community in the mid-19th Century near the Colts Neck/Lincroft border. Author Jayme A. Sokolow will trace the evolution of this commune and reveal its successes and challenges.

Jayme Sokolow was born and raised in Perth Amboy and attended Trenton State Teachers College (The College of New Jersey) as an undergraduate. He has been a teacher, federal employee, and, for the past three decades, a businessman. He is the author of business and history articles and four books, including The North American Phalanx (1843-1855): A Nineteenth-Century Utopian Community (2009). This book is based on over 25 manuscript collections, especially the collections of the Monmouth County Historical Association Library & Archives in Freehold.





Middletown voters, in a 1920 referendum, opted to establish a public library that opened the next year. In New Jersey, once a library is established by referendum, it can be dissolved only through public referendum. The Navesink Library that opened as a private association library in 1914 was later operated by the Middletown Library until it and all branches were terminated by Middletown.
